| — THE DOMESDAY BOOK | 1) 11th c. It was created by one of William the Conqueror's scribes. Believed to be one of the more important books ever written. It contains two maps and describes England back in the 11th century. |
| — THE FLOWERS BOOK OF HOURS BY SIMON BENING | 2) 13th century. A Slavic Manuscript talking about the history of Kievan Rus. |
| — LES TRES BELLES HEURES DE NOTRE DAME | 3) 15th century. Made by Master of the Parement de Narbonne and Master of the Holy Spirit and the Master John the Baptist and the of Limburg brothers. The book of hours filled with detailed miniatures illustrating life in the middle ages and religious scenes. The miniatures include detailed historiated initials and figures in the margins and a large miniature. |
| — RADZIWILL CHRONICLE | 4) 16th century. made by Simon Bening. This Flemish book done in the Trompe l'oil style and including precious stones and birds and flowers (which gave way the title of the book). The book starts with a calendar and then goes into prayers and Gospels. The miniatures depict everyday life in the medieval ages. |
| — THE HUNTING BOOK OF GASTON PHÉBUS | 5) 14th century. This book is filled with illuminated miniatures of hunt scenes and animals involved with the hunt. |
