About the scribes:

Amandus, Haregarius and Sigvaldus are three monks from the 9th century believed to have made the Canon Tables.

Hans Ried, 16th century scribe who worked on such pieces as the Book of Heroes for King Maximilian I. He was viewed as a highly skilled calligrapher.

Giovannino dei Grassi was one of the two artists who did the Visconti Hours in the 15th century.

Nikolaus Glockendon, 16th century Germany. Worked with such great people as Albrecht Dürer. Albrecht actually introduced Albert von Brandenburg to Nikolaus who later commissioned him to make a pray book (The Glockendon Hours).

Furius Dionysius Filocalus, one of the earliest known names for scribes, he signed a copy of the Roman Calendar of 354 AD.

William de Brailes was an English Illuminator from the early to mid 13th century who would sign his work in Latin and French.

Raulinus was a English scribe who studied in France during the 13th century. Later he moved to Bologna where he worked as a scribe. He was very fond of women.
